WHAT'S HAPPENING



San Carlos Apache tribe stops at Arch St on their way to DC.

A caravan of members of the San Carlos Apache tribe, along with representatives from other tribes started from San Carlos, Arizona are on their way to DC, to rally and protest over their land struggle. They will be joined by folks from across the country and will be in DC where they will rally in front of Congress on July 21 and 22. They are fighting to save sacred land from being handed over to a mining company - Resolution Copper, which would destroy the land and have a devastating environmental impact on the surrounding area. For years they have been successfully fighting off a bill that would give Resolution Copper rights to mine two big areas of sacred land: Apache Leap and Oak flat in southeastern Arizona. This year, Sen. McCain got this passed by attaching this bill as a part of the National Defense Authorization Act, which didn't allow for any parts of the Act to be voted on separately. Otherwise, the land would have been protected under an amendment that protects sacred land. The company is also exempt for completing environmental studies on environmental impact of drilling under the Defense Act. There is another bill that has been introduced in the House to try and stop this development. For more information see their web page:

Rebuild Burned Black Churches

Since the massacre at Emanuel AME Church and the actions taken regarding the confederate flag, several churches with predominately black memberships have burned. As of the writing of this announcement, at least four of the fires are believed to be the result of arson. Historically, the burning of black churches by white supremacists was a violent attempt to interrupt the civil rights movement and to try to intimidate all efforts to ensure the human and civil rights of black persons. This latest rash of fires needs to be countered with an outpouring of support for the congregations and communities under attack.

Today, and for at least **every Sunday in July**, Arch Street UMC will receive special offerings to assist with the rebuilding of the blacks churches destroyed by an arsonist's fire. Christ Church Cathedral Episcopal in St. Louis has established a fund for this purpose. What a great idea and act of solidarity! Several United Methodist congregations are listed as supporting the effort.

ASUMC's Church Council will consider this option among others and decide how best to distribute the funds raised. The goal of ASUMC's "REBUILD BURNED BLACK CHURCHES FUND is \$2000.00. Dear ASUMC Members and Friends:

On Wednesday, July 15, 2015 I was informed that an anti-abortion advocacy group intends to stage a demonstration outside of Arch Street United Methodist Church today, Sunday, July 19. In conversation with the Civil Affairs Division of the Philadelphia Police I was told that the group is verbally aggressive and visually confrontational. For that reason there will be a police presence in order to protect the civil and human rights of everyone. The group will not enter the church but will probably have provocative and graphic posters, pamphlets and a public address system. The hours slated for the demonstration are from 9:30am to 11:30am.

I have recruited people who feel called to provide "hospitality" in the midst of what could be a stressful and tense time. I am most concerned about folks entering and leaving the church during the time of the demonstration and so there are greeters positioned at all church doors. The greeters are identified with name tags and serve to welcome folks coming for worship.

It is my prayer and faithful expectation that the ASUMC fellowship will practice and provide respectful resolve even if yelled at, questioned and accused of things you never dreamed of. So, please, as you are entering and leaving the church today, maintain a peaceful presence and meditative mood.



The paragraphs below were extracted from www.UMC.org and explain clearly how to process denominational statements and positions.

"It's important to note that the Church's statements on social issues, such as abortion, represent the effort of the General Conference to speak to human issues in the contemporary world from a sound biblical and theological foundation. They are intended to be instructive and persuasive, but they are not church law and are not binding on members. Members will hold differing views on abortion. There is no requirement for members to agree with the Church's view.

As Rev. Thomas Frank, United Methodist Professor of Theology, said, the church "asks all United Methodists to consider these positions and accept them as the collective wisdom of the church, but it does not expect all United Methodists to agree with all such statements." (Source: Polity, Practice, and the Mission of The United Methodist Church by Thomas Edward Frank)

The Book of Resolutions also says, "You may find that your denomination's policies give you more "food for thought.' Maybe you will agree with the denomination's position. On the other hand, you may disagree. Either is all right. At the least, you know your church cares and wants you to be a knowledgeable and caring Christian about the issues of the day."
