On Sunday September 13th United Methodist Women will be participating in the Arch Street Mission and Ministry Festival. #### **Arch Street Mission Festival**

On Sunday, September 13, 2015 all of ASUMC's outreach ministry programs and initiatives will be on display. Posters, information sheets and people intimately involved with the ministries of the congregation will be on hand to interpret the many ways the people of ASUMC are involved in mission and ministry throughout the year. Members and friends of the congregation are invited to this festival of faithful service after both the 8:30am and 11:00am services. Light refreshments will be shared and new personal connections will be formed.

## Worship on the Parkway

In advance, of the Pope's visit, representatives of the Secret Service and Homeland Security will conduct a "security sweep" of the area designated for events on the Pope's itinerary. ASUMC in partnership with the Welcome Church (a congregation without walls) and in collaboration with other congregations will share in worship at 19<sup>th</sup> and the Parkway (near the Free Library of Philadelphia) on Sunday, September 20, 2015 (3pm). Due to the security measures during the Pope's visit, there will be no secure or simple access to the church. The Reverend Gregory Holston and his congregation, New Vision United Methodist Church, have invited the Arch Street UMC family to worship with them on that Sunday. The ASUMC Choir is invited to sing and Pastor Robin will preach. New Vision UMC is located at Broad and Tioga Streets and the service will begin at 11:00am.
