They Are All Our Children and They Need All of Us Now Ride the Bus to Harrisburg on June 28! Invite Your Family and Friends!

While legislators in Harrisburg fumble and fidget over the state budget, schoolchildren in Philadelphia try to learn in chaotic, understaffed and undersupplied classrooms.

These representatives, who we elect and pay, can somehow sleep at night after cutting money for schools and participating in a racially biased funding system.

While a Fair Funding Formula law was recently passed, in large part thanks to POWER's efforts, it applies only to new money coming into public education. It will take years to correct the current imbalances.

If you have joined in a POWER action to educate, get out the vote, or visit elected officials on behalf of our public schoolchildren—**Thank You!!**
You are invited to step in once again to help in this effort.

If you have been meaning to add your voice to fight the injustice in school funding, this could be your best chance for quite a while.

Please devote Tuesday June 28 to this cause. Ride the bus from POWER headquarters to Harrisburg with other people of faith from the Philadelphia area to witness and confront injustice where it resides.

Join Arch Street's Immigration Team

Arch Street UMC is a congregational member of the New Sanctuary Movement (NSM), an interfaith movement which works to end injustices against immigrants regardless of immigration status, express radical welcome for all, and ensure that values of dignity, justice, and hospitality are lived out in practice and upheld in policy. We accompany people who are facing deportation and hold workshops to provide information about rights. In the past, NSM worked successfully to make Philadelphia a Sanctuary City. Now NSM is working to make Driver's Licenses available to all, regardless of immigration status. We are working to stop the deportation raids. Recently the Obama Administration announced a new round of deportation raids targeting Central American refugee families. We are working to ensure all our immigrant members know what to do in case of a raid and we have organized teams to take action when we learn of a raid. NSM has an emergency hotline to call if you see an ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency) raid taking place.

Teams of NSM Congregational members have been organized to respond to reported raids.

- A phone tree will start to notify everyone signed up to respond. After the closest congregations are called, we will then call other congregations
- The team will immediately head to the site of the raid
- One person on the team will call others on the phone tree
- The team will gather on the block of the raid.
- The team will hold a vigil - songs, prayer, and any other practice that is meaningful to the congregation.
- The group will take photos and film the raid and NSM staff will call press. We will stay until ICE leaves
- After, we will talk with the family to provide guidance on next steps, talk about accompaniment and be a support for the
- Each team will have a response kit – an NSM banner, signs, an agenda, NSM business cards, and a guide for press. Members should wear NSM t-shirts and make sure the signs are visible. ICE officers are sometimes dressed in street clothes so we want to make sure the family knows we are supporters and not ICE.

New Sanctuary Movement holds a **General Assembly** every other month to provide information about our campaigns and to make plans to implement our goals.
