

New Sanctuaries Movement

The PA House of Representatives ended their last day of session before the election, and did not vote on HB 1885, the Anti-Sanctuary City bill!

We have successfully stopped this bill for now, but we are not 100% out of the woods. The House has two more days of session in mid-November after the election. These days are typically for ceremonies and picking leadership, not voting. We also expect that after the election, the momentum will fade for this bill. However, we are not fully done until the session formally ends.

Congratulations and a heart-felt thank you to everyone who put so much heart into fighting this very dangerous and racist bill. In the last two weeks, we have moved mountains! We held a Sukkot ritual and an all night prayer vigil; made hundreds of calls to our State Senators and Representatives; organized 225 signatures on a faith leader letter; sent people to MILPA's and Casa's rally in Harrisburg; and had people praying across the city in three different languages.
