Arch Street UMC 2017 Lenten Series

The 2017 Lenten Series begins on Ash Wednesday, March 1, 2017 and continues through Holy Week. The theme for the series is "The Last Week" based on the book with the same name by Marcus J. Borg and John Dominic Crossan. The Ash Wednesday service will take place in the main sanctuary and feature piano music, preaching, Holy Communion and the imposition of ashes. The remainder of the Wednesdays in Lent, including the Wednesday of Holy Week will feature an in depth study of the last week in the life of Jesus.
