Sunday April 2, 2–6 PM, Friends Center, 1501 Cherry St.

Grounding for Civil Disobedience: Nonviolent Action Training

This training session is for people willing to engage in civil disobedience. This means you would agree to risk arrest—not something that POWER or other organizations we work with would take lightly, but which at times is an effective tool. This is of course a personal decision. This training is sponsored by POWER and two other nonprofits experienced in training activists in nonviolent direct action.

Rally for Social Justice: Worker Rights Equals Human Rights

On the anniversary of the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, who was killed while he was in Memphis supporting black sanitation workers, we gather to honor his legacy and honor workers fighting for human dignity and racial and economic justice.

Black Work Matters—Understanding the Report and Actions for City Council

After more than a year-long study of the job market and wages in Philadelphia, POWER and other groups issued a stunning report that details the history, present state, and future of economic dignity for workers in our city. The report offers hope and a plan to return good jobs for Philly workers. This presentation will leave you amazed and hopeful and wanting to be part of the rebirth that is possible if we are committed to it.

Web Meeting on School Formula Funding Legislation, hosted by David Mosenkis

Current law distributes only 6% of state public school funding through the fair funding formula. The other 94% is distributed in the inequitable and racially biased way that it has been for decades. During this meeting, POWER leader and statistician David Mosenkis will summarize the racial bias and other inequities in the current funding, and present an overview of which districts it benefits and harms. He'll also show why the majority of Pennsylvanians, and the majority of state legislators, would benefit from putting all state money through the fair formula and present for discussion a proposal to support legislation to distribute 100% of state funding through the formula, and how we might move forward to achieve this. Pembroke NC to work alongside local leaders on various church and community improvement projects. The Center is the heart and soul of working with the poor of Robeson County – the poorest county in NC. **The United Methodist Church is the driving force behind the Center’s work.** In a conversation, with Pastor Kelly (local leader), he stated that funds and volunteers are desperately needed to clean up and restore the Center so they can resume and upgrade service. The **ASUMC Youth** are so close to this NC community and ask for your help. **Pastor Robin has set a stretch goal of \$8,000.** We have collected 1/3 of our goal.
