

Ending DACA would be morally reprehensible, denying hundreds of thousands of young people the chance to integrate and thrive. Betsy, Wilhelmina, Dottie, and Nancy went to an exciting Action Team meeting on August 8th and we want to share it with you. Briefly, POWER is developing a 5-year strategic plan to attract funding and keep our efforts focused. The first step was for each strategy team to draft a 1-year plan. We heard those presentations and gave feedback. The teams will now refine their plans for presentation at the September meeting. Here is what they are proposing:

Education – In time for the 2018/19 school year: (1) pass a new state law to distribute 100% of school funding through the Fair Funding Formula; (2) dissolve the SRC and return control of city schools to Philadelphia.

Economic Dignity – (1) Enact a Twenty-first Century Minimum Wage of \$15/hour for city contractors and subcontractors; (2) get PECO’s commitment to source 20% of its energy from local renewable sources by 2025.

Live Free – End cash bail. This would reduce Philadelphia’s jail population by two-thirds and end the devastation caused to individuals and families when a poor person is unable to make even a modest cash bail and loses his or her job and home while waiting for a trial date.

This is a bold, prophetic vision for changing entrenched laws and practices that hurt some of our most vulnerable communities and neighbors. Stay tuned for ways you can help in this important work—and start by joining us at the September 12th Action Team meeting!

New Sanctuary Movement

In the last six months, NSM has collected 2,500 petition signatures, working with a committee of immigrant leaders to coordinate this work. POWER has joined the campaign. NSM held a meeting with the Police Commissioner, which happened as a direct outcome of applying direct pressure on the city to listen. The goal is to lift up people in poverty who are affected by this - people who can't make an insurance payment get hurt the most. The city made \$6.5 million from this program, half from auctioning cars taken through LiveStop. NSM is ready plans to deliver the petitions and conduct a creative action on Thursday, September 7th, involving 25 people each carrying 100 signatures. NSM needs each congregation to send two representatives to the action. NSM has 25 member congregations, which is perfect for this! More info will be sent out soon!
