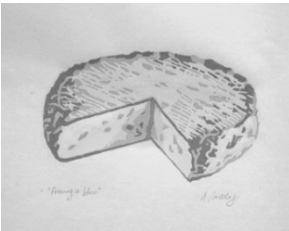

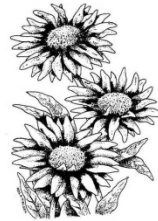

Conference Raising funds, Sending Aid to Puerto Rico



*Will launch \$100,000 fundraising goal
in January*

Like the three kings, or Magi, who journeyed to Bethlehem bearing gifts for Christ's birth, three Eastern PA Conference Cabinet members will visit Puerto Rico in the coming months bringing aid to residents on the disaster-stricken island. Their journey will follow the launch of a \$100,000 conference-wide fundraising campaign to help the Methodist Church of Puerto Rico in its disaster recovery efforts.

Three district superintendents, the Rev. Irving Cotto, of the North District Superintendent, the Rev. BumKoo "BK" Chung of the West District and the Rev. Tracy Bass of the East District will visit in February some of the 96 Methodist churches in Puerto Rico and their pastors and members, as guests of Bishop Hector Ortiz.

Healing the Reproach of Women

Luke 1:24-25

²⁴ After these days his wife Elizabeth conceived, and for five months she kept herself hidden, saying, ²⁵ "Thus the Lord has done for me in the days when he looked on me, to take away my reproach among people."

As almost daily we hear from the "Silence Breakers"--Time magazine's name for the women (and some men) who are revealing painful, alleged sexual misconduct they have suffered at the hands of powerful men--Bishop Peggy Johnson challenges us to recognize and respond to the overall oppression inflicted upon countless women in our nation and around the world.

For Advent she recalls Elizabeth, once disdained for her seeming inability to conceive a child, expressing relief when she learned surprisingly that she would give birth to a son who would become John the Baptist: "Thus, the Lord has done for me in the days when he looked on me, to take away my reproach among people." (Luke 1:25).

"The practice of sexism is a form of reproach," writes the Bishop Johnson in her latest Bishop's Blog essay. "Still today, women get paid less than men for the same work. Most corporations have men as their CEO's; and sexual abuse and domestic violence mostly happens to women."

She laments the still-common prejudice against and rejection of women pastors and the many complaints of sexual misconduct and harassment by clergy and laity she has received during her tenure in this area. She even recounts her own untold experiences with sexual abuse and admits that keeping silent is "how the practice of abuse continues."

"Many fine women pastors have had difficulties in ministry, not because of their lack of skills or calling, but because some in the church (men and women) cannot accept their authority or the unique gifts that they bring," she writes.

"The church needs to have honest conversations about these issues and strive to live in more healthy ways, as we continue the work of ministry," she pleads. "First steps include talking, teaching and creating safe spaces for people to share their stories."
